# GENERAL INFORMATION

The NGO **Association of Estonian Open Youth Centres (AEYC)** is a nationwide umbrella organization which was founded on November 9th, 2001 with the aim to connect Estonian youth centers from all over the country. Currently, the association has 81 members with 226 youth centers. Since 2015, AEYC is EVS and **ESC coordinating organization**.

The ESC Volunteering Partnership project **"Open Youth Work**" aims to promote opportunities and improve the quality of international youth work, to develop respect and tolerance, to support social and cultural diversity, and to improve competencies for international and multicultural activities and societal life among young people, youth workers, and community members.

Open youth centers are professional non-formal educational environments providing a diverse variety of services and activities to local young people aged 7-26. Youth centers follow the principles of open youth work- permit open access to all of the youth, diverse opportunities for leisure time, support for young people, and their ideas, space for socializing, and partnership.

Youth centers have the capacity to work with youth from different backgrounds and be socially inclusive. They are flexible in their activities, introduce different perspectives, and develop critical thinking and tolerance. Youth participation starting from the grassroots level is a key to social inclusion and to mutual dialogue. This is how the future is made.

During the volunteering service, the participant will be involved in the daily activities of the youth centre and will be **provided opportunities for initiatives and collaboration with associated partners in the hosting community**. The participant will be able to co-create their own volunteering journey and contribute with their own ideas and skills.

# ESTONIA



Estonia, officially the Republic of Estonia (Estonian: Eesti Vabariik), is a country on the eastern coast of the Baltic Sea in Northern Europe.

The territory of Estonia consists of the mainland and of 2,222 islands in the Baltic Sea, covering a total area of 45,227 km2

Tallinn, the capital of Estonia, and Tartu are the largest cities and urban areas in the country.

In 1987 the peaceful Singing Revolution began against Soviet rule, resulting in the restoration of de facto independence on 20 August 1991.

Estonia is a developed country with an advanced, high-income economy that was among the fastest-growing in the EU since its entry in 2004.

One of the world's most digitallyadvanced societies. It is bordered to the north by Finland, to the west by Sweden, to the south by Latvia, and to the east by Russia.

The official language of the country, Estonian, is the second-mostspoken Finnic language.

Other notable cities include Narva, Pärnu, Kohtla-Järve and Viljandi.

The country ranks very high in the Human Development Index and compares well in measures of economic freedom, civil liberties, education, and press freedom.

2005 - the first state to hold elections over the Internet 2014 - the first state to provide eresidency.

Estonian citizens receive universal health care, free education, and the longest paid maternity leave in the OECD.

With a population of 1.3 million Estonia is one of the least populous members of the EU, the OECD, the Schengen Area, NATO, and from 2020, the United Nations Security Council.

The sovereign state of Estonia is a democratic unitary parliamentary republic divided into fifteen counties.
